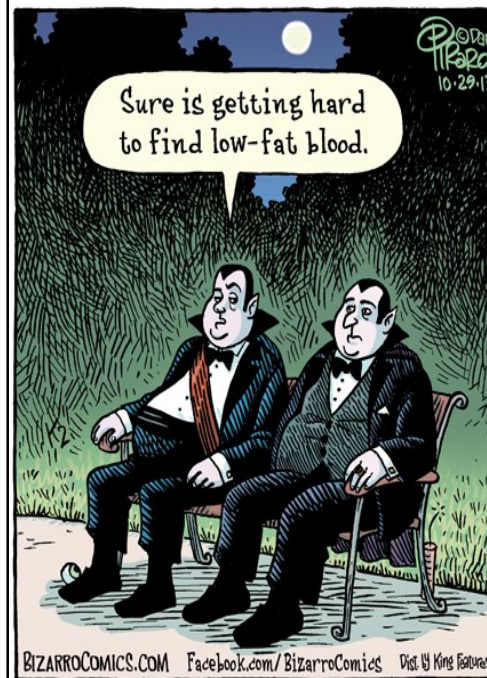

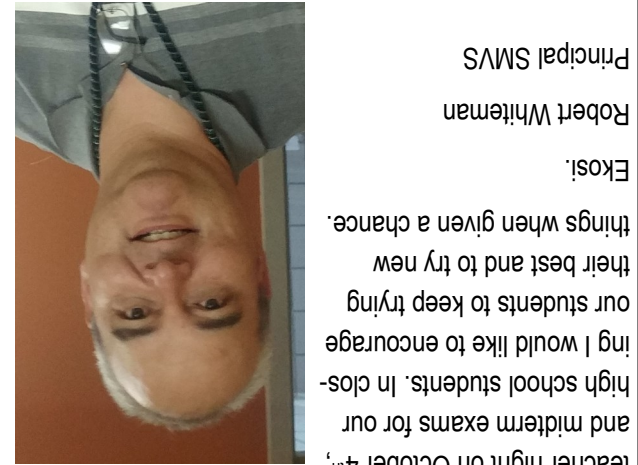

SMVS EVENTS

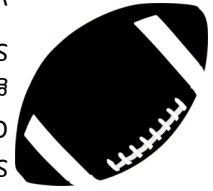
