In the summer of 2017, Lac La Ronge Indian Band (LLRIB) signed a collaboration agreement with Cameco Corporation. As part of this agreement, Cameco is contributing \$50,000.00 on an annually, based on matching contributions from LLRIB. For the first scholarship program, LLRIB will contribute \$50,000.00. Kitsaki Management Limited Partnership will also contribute \$50,000.00, for a total of \$150,000.00 to be awarded to full-time students, in attendance during the 2024-2025 academic year. The LLRIB scholarship program has been in existence since 2003 with limited funds. LLRIB is very pleased that the scholarship program has significantly increased to provide support to our students.

Cliff Charles Memorial Scholarship

(Strategic Scholarships)

Deadline for submitting scholarship application is September 30, 2024



In 1992, the Lac La Ronge Indian Band (LLRIB) began administering the Post-Secondary student support program from Indian and Northern Affairs Canada (INAC). Cliff Charles was the first LLRIB Post-Secondary Coordinator. Cliff strongly believed and advocated for higher and continued education for Band members. Mr. Charles had a Diploma in Power Engineering from SIAST, a Certificate and Diploma in Administration and was working on a Degree in Administration. In 2002, Cliff was one class short of a Degree at the time of his passing in September.

This scholarship is to encourage students to engage in studies, which directly contribute to the advancement of Indian self-government and economic-sufficiency.

How to apply

Applicants must submit:

- Completed scholarship application;
- Post-Secondary transcripts;
- Acceptance letter from Post-Secondary Institution for the 2024-2025 academic year;
- Names and contact information for 2 references (one academic) and letters; and
- Cover letter;

All continuing LLRIB full-time Post-Secondary students may apply for one of the 25 scholarships of \$2,500.00 based on transcripts from the 2023-2024 academic year.



Criteria for the Cliff Charles Memorial Scholarship is as follows: academic grades for the Fall and Winter semesters, special significance of program enrolled in, volunteer work, leadership, financial need, and special circumstances in overcoming adversity. All awards will require a completed application with 2 reference (one academic) letters.

Note:

- *The above scholarship is awarded annually in September for the previous academic year.
- *Scholarships are for full-time continuing students only.

FOR ALL ELIGIBLE LAC LA RONGE INDIAN BAND MEMBERS ONLY

Eligible students may apply to both scholarship programs; however, a student will only be awarded one scholarship annually.
